#### Overview:

The advent of the corona virus (COVID-19) has significantly affected all aspects of human activities and economies around the world. Lessons are being learnt as businesses and states are continually reviewing and implementing strategies to help deliver the appropriate response to this pandemic.

BusinessDay has been in the forefront of creating awareness on the ramifications of this pandemic and its economic impact. At the same time, BusinessDay has launched its Digital Dialogue Series as a quick response, knowledge sharing platform for policy-makers and business leaders to share and learn lessons on how to efficiently respond in these unfamiliar times.

## **Objectives:**

There are 3 main motivations for these Digital Dialogues, which will permeate through every session, some more than others, depending on the topic:

1. **How the crisis has evolved** – Medical status / Public Health position: To discuss and provide an understanding of where we are in relation to the management of COVID–19 pandemic, in Nigeria and Africa from a medical/healthcare perspective.

- 2. How the disruption is shaking the foundations of economic prosperity laid over the last century Spectrum of choices facing policy-makers and business leaders: Following a review of the different likely scenarios from the decision-makers' standpoint, the next goal will be to appraise how the Nigerian government, and businesses are responding and should respond to COVID-19:
  - What are the policy (political, economic) choices available?
  - What are the strategic choices we can and should take?
- 3. What the future holds Scenario scoping: To provide some understanding of what the future will look like. Indeed, the future is uncertain and volatile. However, given the choices we make now, the policies we adopt now, what should we expect the future to be? The discussions will start by a review of the socio-political landscape, thereafter address the macro-economic issues and finally assess the impact of the pandemic on critical sectors of the economy.
